



Identifying equipment and appliances in your home

During your virtual energy assessment, the energy specialist will refer to areas in your home where there is potential for energy savings.

Taking photos like the ones below may be valuable during the assessment process.

Hot Water Heater

Take a stand-back photo of your hot water heater and heating system, as well as a photo of the nameplate or label with the model number and serial number.

The nameplate of your hot water heater will generally be located on the front or side of the unit











Water Heaters: Additional Types

- 1. Combi: Same as the boiler
- 2. Indirect Storage Tank: No label
- 3. Tankless Coil (integrated): No label
- 4. On-Demand (tankless): Label

Boiler

Take a stand-back photo of your heating system (and water heater) as well as a photo of the nameplate or label with the model number and serial number.


The nameplate of your heating equipment can usually be found once you remove the front cover, or on the side of the unit.






- 1. Boiler

Furnace

Take a stand-back photo of your heating system (and water heater) as well as a photo of the nameplate or label with the model number and serial number.

The nameplate of your heating equipment can usually be found once you remove the front cover, or on the side of the unit. See the red circles above for typical locations.



Electric Heat

If your home is heated with electric heat, you may have either electric baseboards or a ductless or ducted air source heat pump.

- 1. Wall hung ductless minisplit
- 2. Floor mounted ductless minisplit
- 3. Electric baseboard









Central AC

Your home may be cooled with ducted central air conditioning. If so, you will find one or more condensers on the outside of your home.

The nameplate can typically be found on the rear panel.
